Re: District Opportunity to Cure its Unlawful Actions, Request to Meet March 26 and/or March 28, 2019

Dear Mr. Aguilar:

This is to inform you that the members of the Sacramento City Teachers Association have voted overwhelmingly to authorize a strike against the Sacramento City Unified School District in protest of the actions of you, Board President Jessie Ryan and other District leaders in engaging in unlawful behavior in violation of California law.

Prior to establishing a strike date, however, we want to provide you an opportunity to cure the unlawful activity.

Accordingly, a committee selected by SCTA will be available to meet with a committee selected by the District (that has the authority to negotiate on behalf of the District) on Tuesday, March 26 and/or Thursday, March 28 at 4 p.m. at the SCTA office to negotiate over remedies to the District's unlawful actions, in the hopes that a strike can be avoided.

To avoid the unnecessary expense to the District of having to pay for substitute teachers and to ensure that Sac City students don't miss the opportunity to learn from their regular, certificated educators, we proposed starting the meetings at 4 p.m. so that educators can participate after the school day ends. In addition, because of the District's unwillingness to provide rooms to accommodate our bargaining team, including the District's inability to provide a secure, confidential caucus room during our recent arbitration, we believe that the SCTA office is the appropriate place to meet.

We look forward to meeting with the District's representatives on Tuesday, March 26, at 4 p.m. at the SCTA office.
