PROCEDURES: When high school staff has made its selection, the student shall be notified by the Principal no later than

Friday, February 16, 2024.

The selected student must submit an online application and supporting documents Friday, April 12, 2024.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE WINNER:

The Mayor, City of Sacramento, and the Superintendent (or designee), Sacramento City Unified School District, will announce the winner of the George H. Clark Scholarship at a meeting of the Sacramento City Council. The student and his/her parents/guardians will be invited to attend this meeting.

APPLICATION ATTACHMENTS AND REQUIREMENTS:

Any student who meets the stated qualifications must complete an <u>online application</u>. The completed application must be accompanied by the following documents:

- 1. <u>Student Letter Addressed to Trustees, George Clark Memorial Scholarship</u> (student letter must be typed in the appropriate box on the application, must be 750 words or less and must include the following):
 - ☐ Describe your educational and vocational goals (short-term **and** long-term)
 - ☐ How you plan to use the scholarship funds
- 2. Two Letters of Recommendation (MUST INCLUDE):
 - ☐ Letters from outside the school (i.e. employer, pastor, youth leader, or community leader)
- 3. Transcript:
 - An unofficial transcript of student's high school record, including the first semester grades of your senior year
