1. 40 Credits in English
2. 20 Credits in Math
3. 20 Credits in Science
4. 40 Credits in Social Studies
5. 10 Credits in Visual or Performing Arts
6. 20 Credits in PE
7. 10 Credits in World Languages
8. 65 Credits in Electives
9. Proficiency in Technology Literacy
10. Complete a Service Learning Project or Senior Project

Senior Project Requirements

Each High School has the autonomy to set the parameters for the senior project graduation requirement. However, the following requirements are common:

- Choosing a topic within a field of career interest
- Both a practical and research aspect
- Engaging with a mentor
- Practical application/internship
- Community service hours
- A Defense of Learning, judged by a panel of community members and staff

Conditions in the Pandemic

- Increased stress for both students and staff
- Disproportionate hardship for students and families
- Students are unable to conduct community service or internships
- Limited ability for both students and staff to meet other regular expectations of the Senior Project, such as a Defense of Learning

We cannot allow our students to fail to graduate due to an inability to complete the Senior Project.
