## English Learner PROGRAM Description ELEMENTARY

The two main goals of programs serving English Learners are to develop proficiency in English and to provide access to the core curriculum. In accordance with state law, the Sacramento City Unified School District offers three types of educational programs for English Learners. Students in all three programs receive daily ELD instruction at their level.

Structured English Immersion (SEI) (CELDT Overall is Beginning or Early Intermediate)

Students in a SEI class will receive a minimum of one period of ELD. They will also receive specially designed academic instruction in English (SDAIE) intended to increasingly move students towards full access to the core curricula and grade level standards. In this program, nearly all classroom instruction is in English, but with a curriculum and presentation designed for children who are learning English as a second language. Native language (Spanish or other languages) instruction and materials may be used to help students learn the core curriculum, as appropriate to their needs. When feasible, students will be clustered by home language in order to provide primary language support, either by the classroom teacher or other bilingual personnel. All English Learners will be placed in Structured English Immersion, unless you request otherwise, until they become reasonably fluent in English.

English Language Mainstream (ELM) (CELDT Overall is Intermediate, Early Advanced or Advanced) In this program, all classes are taught in English. This program is best suited for English Learners who already have "reasonable fluency" in English. In an ELM program students receive ELD and differentiated instruction in the core content areas. You have the right to request that your child be placed in an English Language Mainstream program. To do so, please complete the form entitled "Parent Request for Mainstream" and give to the school principal.

## Alternative (Bilingual) Program

In this program, students are taught in their primary language and English. Academic instruction in the primary language is used to provide access to the core curriculum and develop literacy in the native language, so that students will achieve success in both English literacy and core curriculum. You have the right to request that your child be placed in a Bilingual Program by filling out and signing the Waiver for Bilingual Education (see other side). The school must grant your waiver request unless it is determined that your child's educational needs would not be met in a Bilingual Program. If the school denies your waiver request, you have the right to appeal. If the school currently does not offer an alternative bilingual program (due to less than 20 approved waivers at a grade level), you may still request the program or you may request a transfer to another school in our district and provide your own transportation. Currently, the following schools have alternative programs: Edward Kemble (K-3 Spanish), Cesar Chavez (4-6 Spanish), and Ethel Phillips (K-3) Spanish, Elder Creek (K-3) Chinese, William Land (K-2) Chinese, and Susan B. Anthony (K-3) Hmong.
