Bright Spots and Opportunities

- Almost all student groups and 'All Students' improved in the percentage of students meeting 'prepared' status on the CCI indicator. The majority of student groups improved their graduation rate.
- Both the Graduation Rate and College/Career Indicators declined from Green to Yellow reflecting minimal year over year change.
- Significant gaps in performance exist for multiple student groups including Students with Disabilities, English learners, Foster Youth, Homeless Youth, African American students, American Indian or Alaska Native students, and Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander Students.

Graduation Rate Reporting

The California Department of Education (CDE) reports graduation rates in a number of different ways based on school type and reporting location. The two primary reporting locations are DataQuest, CDE's data website for the public, and the California School Dashboard.

Туре	Description
One-Year Graduation Rate	Percentage of students who graduate in the selected academic year. Includes Grade 12 students and any Grade 11 students who graduate early.
Four-Year Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rate	Percentage of students who graduate from high school in four years. The cohort is adjusted for students who transfer in/out, emigrate, or becomes deceased. Students who drop-out remain in the cohort.
Combined four- and five- year Graduation Rate*	Includes students who graduated in four years or five years in the selected academic year. Fifth year graduates are students from the prior graduation class.

*The combined four- and five-year graduation rate is being used for the first time on the 2019 California School Dashboard. As a result, the 2018 Graduation Rate results have been recalculated for the 2019 Dashboard ONLY. The 2018 California School Dashboard has NOT been revised and all results displayed in past dashboards are products of different calculation methodology.

College/Career Indicator

The College/Career Indicator is a measure of how many graduates are prepared for college or career. Students are placed in one of three levels: Prepared, Approaching Prepared, or Not Prepared.

Career Technical Education (CTE) Pathway

Pathway completion with a grade of C- or better in the capstone course plus one of the Additional Criteria below:

- Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments: Level 3 or higher in ELA and at least a Level 2 in mathematics, or Level 3 or higher in mathematics and at least a Level 2 in ELA
- One semester/two quarters/two-trimesters of College Credit Courses with a grade of C- or better in academic/CTE subjects where college credits are awarded for each course




Percentage of Students Graduating and Percentage of Students Placing in 'Prepared' Level

Results in Descending Order by 2019 Graduation Rate Dashboard Performance



Percentage of Students Graduating and Percentage of Students Placing in 'Prepared' Level










 - Course pre-registration
 - Course clean-up
- Leverage assistant principals as "agents of change" in leading this work

Goals	HJHS will increase graduation rates from 78.85% to 85%. HJHS will increase A-G rates from 38.62% to 48%.


2018 and 2019 Results by Student Group and Program Participation

Results in Descending Order by 2019 Dashboard Performance







Percentage of Students Placing in 'Prepared' Level on the College/Career Indicator *Results in Descending Order by 2019 Dashboard Performance*




Percentage of Students Placing in 'Prepared' Level on the College/Career Indicator *Results in Descending Order by 2019 Dashboard Performance*




Graduation Dashboard Indicator:

2018-2019 Results by School Site





2018-2019 Results by School Site




Percentage of Students Placing in 'Prepared' Level on the College/Career Indicator *Results in Descending Order by 2019 Dashboard Performance*
